

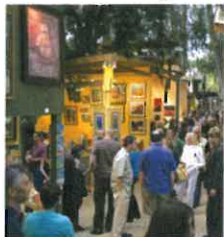

The rigorous jury process results in stunning art, covering a complete spectrum of media, by over 145 of coastal Orange County's most accomplished artists. tures art workshops, several dining options, nightly musical entertainment and hands-on demonstrations. Special art-related attractions and events such as jazz concerts, wine and chocolate pairings, and guided art tours throughout the eight-week run provide entertainment for all.
